Course Description

This is a specialized but introductory course for applicants who aspire to step into the vast, and thrilling territories of Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL). Over the course of 42 sessions of practice, discussions, and assignments of moderate difficulty, students will develop their competence in teaching young learners and raise their awareness of the theoretical premises which influence the quality of language learning/teaching. Practical matters will be addressed in detail throughout the course and students will be asked to teach different parts of coursebooks along the way.

Course Objectives

- Relative acquaintance with the theoretical underpinnings of language teaching.
- Relative acquaintance with learning psychology.
- Development of competence in teaching language skills.
- Development of language proficiency (secondary aim)
- Development of classroom management skills.
- Running language tasks.

Assumptions, Prerequisites, and Co-requisites

Students who have taken up this course are assumed to have:

- enthusiasm for language teaching.
- superior competence in English.
- little or no effective background in language teaching.
- a minimum age of 17
- willingness to actively learn, experiment, and work in an interactive environment, individually and as part of a team.

Grading, Assessment and Evaluation

Grading for the course is on a scale of 0-100, with the following weightings:

1) Class Participation, Attendance, Assignments, & Quizzes (35/100)

The students are expected to actively and regularly participate in discussions. Unexcused absences and tardiness at any time during the course will subject the student(s) to loss of score. Students will be subject to dismissal if they make 4 unexcused absences or a total of 8 times of tardiness. All quizzes are online.

2) Written Final Examination (35/100)


At the end of the course, the students will be given a formal summative final exam to evaluate their knowledge of teaching theories. The exam will be in a multiple-choice format with a total of 70 questions. The content to be studied comes from the pamphlet.

3) **Final DEMO** (30/100)

Following the final examination, the students will be given 15 minutes to present their DEMOs. The students are <u>at will</u> to choose any content and any skill from Wira's coursebooks (i.e., American English File Series) to teach in the DEMO session.


Band Descriptors

<u>PASS A</u> is awarded to a student who achieves a total score of 85 or higher. (GREEN AREA) Typically, these students can do a wide range of essential teaching tasks effectively. They are proficient users of English with a minimum of IELTS BAND SCORE 7. With some guidance and help, along with a number of observations, they can start teaching English at lower levels.




PASS is awarded to a student who achieves a total score of 70 to 84. (YELLOW AREA)

Typically, these students can do a limited range of essential teaching tasks. They may or may not be proficient users of English who have not been able to effectively develop their teaching skills. These students may be able to work as teacher assistants in different institutes and have the potential to become teachers at a later time.



An **UNQUALIFIED** student has failed to achieve a total score of 70 and will be awarded no certificate. An UNQUALIFIED grade suggests that it is too early for the student to think of language teaching as a profession. (**RED AREA**)
